

#### **FEES**

Dear Members,

Kindly collect fees only in two heads; namely 'Tuition Fees' and 'Development Fees'.

Tuition Fees include your computer lab fee, science lab fee, sports fee and other fees. Development fees must not be more than 15% of your total fees.

Eg.: If the total fees of a class is ₹ 40,000, then it should be split into two as Tuition Fees ₹ 35,000 and Development Fees ₹ 5,000 (Less than 15%)

Both the fees can be collected under one receipt, but the Development Fees must be transferred to a separate bank account.

Development Fees should be utilised only for replacement of furniture, fittings and equipment. Do not spend it for maintenance, as you can claim maintenance as expense.

You can have 15% of total fees collected in a year as Surplus Fund, which can be used for purchase of additional land or for new building constructions.

Expenses heads can be as per your auditor's suggestion.

No donation or capitation fees should be collected.

Remember, the court orders are applicable to the members of AMPS only

# Judicial **ORDERS**

#### **Submission of Oasis**

CBSE was imposing a hefty fine of ₹50,000 for non-submission of details asked in Oasis. Challenging the circular AMPS filed a writ petition in the Madras High Court.

W.P.No. 10929 of 2017. Order dated 24.04.2017

An interim stay was granted on 28.04.2017 The Court ordered AMPS to pay ₹1,00,000 as deposit. The stay was applicable to AMPS members only.

In 2022, CBSE withdrew the circular. Accordingly, the deposit of ₹1,00,000 was retured as per order dated 02.02.2022

#### **Fee determination Committees Power**

AMPS challenged the power of fee determination committee to fix fees for CBSE and ICSE schools.

Hon'ble Mrs. Justice R. Banumathi and Hon'ble Mr. Justice R. Subbiah dismissed our challenge and said that both CBSE and ICSE schools are 'private schools' within the meaning of Sec 2(j) of the Tamil Nadu Schools (Regulation of Collection of Fee) Act, 2009 and its provisions.

AMPS challenged the order in the Supreme Court and an interim stay order was obtained on 28th November 2016. From that date, the Tamil Nadu Schools (Regulation of Collection of Fee) Act, 2009 is not applied for all CBSE and ICSE Schools. This is a landmark judgement which no other State association could not get.

# Supreme Court Interim Order Date: 28.01.2016

#### SUPREME COURT OF INDIA

Pentition(s) for Special Leave to Appeal (C) No. (S) 16/2013

Leave granted,

In modification and supersession of our interim order dated 15.01.2015, we direct that for I.C.S.E. and C.B.S.E. schools, the regulatory mechanism of the fee committee shall be limited, during the pendency of the present controversy, to the one contemplated under section 7(3) of the Tamil Nadu Schools (Regulation of Collection of Fees) Act, 2009.

Order obtained by AMPS

#### STATE RECOGNITION

State officials directed all CBSE and ICSE schools to file Form I as per RTE Act. 2009 and get their schools recognised under Tamil Nadu Private Schools Regulation Act 1973, AMPS immediately opposed stating that as per their own RTE Rules 2011, they have not assigned any officer to accord recognition to CBSE and ICSE schools.

Immediately, the State Government amended Rule 12 and said that the Director of School Education is the authority to accord recognition to CBSE and ICSE schools.

AMPS challenged the amendment of Rule 12 and obtained a stay which was in force for two years. We lost the case because CBSE amended its bye laws in 2018 and made it mandatory to obtain recognition.

#### **HIGH COURT OF JUDICATURE - MADRAS**

W.P.No. 32108 of 2014

Petition filed Under Article 226 of Constitution of India, to issue a Writ of Declaration or any other appropriate Writ, order or direction, declaring G.O.Ms.No. 144 School Education (GE) Department dated 18.9.2014 as illegal, unconstitutional and ultra vires the provisions of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 (Central Act No. 35 of 2009) and the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Rules, 2010.

#### Rule 12 of RTE Act Challenge Order Dated: 19-07-2018

Order Pronounced by

#### Ms. Indira Banerjee,

Chief Justice (19.07.2018)

23. The only apprehension expressed in these writ petitions is with regard to interference with the curriculam and syllabus. It is made clear that the State Authorities cannot and shall not interfere with the syllabus and curriculam.

24. Needless to mention that the question of whether the State Government has the power to regulate fees chargeble by private schools affiliated to CBSE shall abide by the result of the proceedings before the Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 5316 of 2016. We make it absolutely clear that we have not gone into this issue.

#### HIGH COURT OF JUDICATURE AT MADRAS

CBSE issued a circular that all schools should only use NCERT books. AMPS challenged that circular and obtained a stay order.

W.P.No. 189007 of 2017

Interim stay order was passed on 26.07.2017 by the hon'ble Mr.Justice N. Kirubakaran

Immediately, CBSE withdrew the circular.

W.A.No. 1528 of 2018.

Advocate M.Purushothaman challenged the withdrawal of the circular by CBSE. AMPS fought back and as a result, CBSE filed an affidavit that CBSE does not insist schools to use only NCERT books and they are free to use any textbooks of their choice.

### **Affidavit filed by CBSE**

6. It is submitted that the National Curriculam Framework 2005 advocates that there should be plurality of textbooks and other resource material. NCF 2005 in its Section 4.6.6 at Page No.94 categorically reiterates the recommendations of Secondary Education Commission 1953 which states No single textbook should be prescribed for any subject of study, but a reasonable number of books which satisfy the standards laid down should be recommended, leaving the choice to the school concerned. The NCF 2005 again highlights the report of Kothari Commission 1968 which categorically suggested that uniform implementation of curriculum undermine the agency of teachers and head teachers and head teachers and render the spirit of exploration and innovation impossible.

7. It is submitted that as far as NCERT is concerned it is an advisory body to Central and State Government and produces model textbook which are adopted by various State Boards. The Council does not have any mechanism to approve text books produced by any other agency whether it is State Government or Private Publishers, Moreover, there is no central database of textbooks published by private publishers across various States. It would be more appropriate if NCERT, which is also an autonomous organization under Union Ministry of Human Resource Development further comment in this regard.

8. It is submitted that as per the policy of CBSE, academic autonomy to schools has been provided regarding text books, and, thus, it is the responsibility of the agency/management running the schools to ensure standard of textbook. Schools are required to take help of the School Management Committees which are mandatory as per the Right to Education Act 2009. School Management Committees (SMC) whose three fourth members are parents or guardians playing an impotant role in deciding all issues including that of text books in schools. The mandate of SMC is to monitor the working of school and prepare and recommend school development plan.

# HIGH COURT OF JUDICATURE AT MADRAS Amended CBSE Bye-laws - Challenge

W.P.No. 35056/2019

CBSE amended its bye laws in 2018. In the new bye-law an exclusive Chapter-12 was included giving enormous power to levy fine on its affiliated schools. AMPS challenged the new bye-law provisions and obtained a stay.

Not only a stay was granted, the court also said that CBSE should not impose any of the penalties in Chapter 12 of the Affiliation bye - laws on the member schools of AMPS.

# PENALTIES AS PER NEW CBSE BYE LAWS Dated: 19-12-2019

Order of the Hon'ble

#### Mr. Justice P.D. Andikesaylu

or

Order: This petition coming on for orders upon perusing the petition and the affidavit filed in support there of and upon hearing the arguments of Mr. AR.L. Sundaresan, Senior Counsel for Mr.L.Murali Krishnan, Advocate for the petitionor and of Mr. T.V. Krishnamachari, Central Government Standing Counsel for 1st Respondent and of Mr. G. Nagarajan, Advocate on behalf of the 2 & 3 Respondents the court made the following order:-

- 2. Learned Senior Counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the penalties provided in Chapter 12 of the Affiliation Bye Laws of the Second Respondent, which is impugned in this Writ Petition, confer arbitrary and unguided power entailing adverse civil consequences to the affiliated schools and the same would have to be stayed till the disposal of the Writ petitions, which contention is disputed by the Learned Counsel for the Respondents.
- 3. Having regard to the aforesaid submissions made, if the Second and Third Respondents intend to impose any of the penalties in Chapter 12 of the Affiliation Bye Laws of the Second Respondent on the member schools of the petitioner Association, the same shall be made only after obtaining prior permission of this Court, until further orders.

#### **TAMIL TEXTBOOK**

Should we use only Tamil Textbooks published by Tamil Nadu Government? NO: You can use any private publishers Tamil Textbooks. Encourage them please.

The director of school education issued a circular on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2016, to all schools with a direction to use only Tamil Nadu Textbooks to teach Tamil.

The above circular was challenged in the High Court of Judicature at madras vide W.P.No. 17809 of 2017.

An interim stay was granted by the Hon'ble Mr.Justice N.Kirabakaran on 27.07.2017

# **TAMIL LEARNING ACT 2006**

#### "Points to remember"

Tamil Learning Act, 2006 (Act 13 of 2006) came into force with effect from 19th June 2006.

Tamil Language was introduced as a compulsory subject in Standard I in the year 2006-07 and extended to Standards I & II in the academic year 2007-08, and it was extended every year in a phased manner till the academic year 2015-16 for Standard X. Many challenged the Act.

Hon'ble First Bench of Madras High Court vide order dated 23.08.2007 in W.P.Nos.33953, 7879 and 10661 of 2006, upheld the validity of the Act. Again, few appealed in the Supreme Court.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court in S.L.P. (Civil) No(s).21224/2007 again upheld the validity of the Tamil Nadu Tamil Learning Act, 2006 on 14.07.2008.

In June 2014 the government issued guidelines on the Tamil public exam to be held on March 2016.

Many schools who have not taught Tamil as 2<sup>nd</sup> language said that there are only two more years to prepare their students for a Tamil public exam, so they sought exemption in the court. Nearly 8,300 students also approached the court for exemption, since they have not been taught Tamil.

Finally, after much deliberation, the Madras High Court passed an interim order dated 25.01.2016 in W.P. No.1498 of 2016, granting exemption to all the students, from writing Tamil Language exam in 10<sup>th</sup> Standard exams to be held in March 2016 only.

Few students who got transferred from other States in Class IX also sought exemption.

With the understanding of the Court, a fresh government order was issued on 02.01.2017. It states that a person who has not studied Tamil for a period of three academic years will be provided exemption. It means, that only students who joined in class IX from another State will be exempted.

Many aided minority schools complained that they could not teach Tamil because the Government have not sanctioned Tamil teachers post. All the cases were referred to a larger bench.

Finally, the Government agreed in the Court to start teaching Tamil in as a subject in standards I to X in all schools (namely Schools under CBSE, ICSE etc.) in a phased manner commencing from the academic year 2015- 2016 for Standard I, from the academic year 2016-2017 for standard I and II and shall be extended up to standard X in academic year 2024 – 2025.

The larger bench compromising of the Honourable Mr. Justice S. Manikumar and the Honourable Mr. Justice Abdul Quddhose and the Honourable Mr. Justice Subramonium Prasad accepted the proposal given by the government and passed an order on 23.09.2019. Accordingly, all students who are studying in Class VIII this academic year 2022 -23 must write 10<sup>th</sup> Board exam in March 2025.

Dear School leaders please understand that no more exemption will be granted to any school or student, as all legal remedies have been exhausted. Kindly do not take risk by allowing your students to take any other subject as 2<sup>nd</sup> language other than Tamil.

We will write to CBSE to have two different level of assessment for Class X Tamil board exam; one **the basic level** and the other **the standard level**. If they fail to do so, then we will seek remedy in the Court through our Association to direct CBSE to provide two level assessments.
